SWCHS hosts Uttlesford Careers Fair

The Careers Fair, hosted by SWCHS on 13th October, saw an impressive turnout with around 2000 students and parents from Uttlesford keen to learn about the world of work and the types of employment and other progression opportunities available in the local area and further afield.

Over 80 organisations were represented at the event with more than 150 exhibitors who willingly gave up their time to speak to young people and their parents about their businesses, and to give advice about jobs in their sector.



Students attending the event were impressed by the range of high quality opportunities that are available to them, and particularly the growing number of Higher Level and Degree Level Apprenticeships. They discovered that a wide range of companies want to attract young people with good A Levels to train with them to degree level – so-called 'learning while earning'.
