I am delighted to announce that we have appointed a Director of our Teaching School Hub. As mentioned earlier in the year, we were one of only six schools to be asked to lead this national trial of Teaching School Hubs and we are delighted to now be leading school-to-school support regionally. Our new Director, Doug Brechin, is a hugely experienced and talented senior leader and we are delighted that he will be joining us after Easter to take on this new role and also join the County High Senior Leadership team as a Deputy Head.

There is a lot to look forward to in March. We have Science Week, Year 9 Politics Week, the annual Music Festival, World Book Day and our School Spring Concert, as well as the excitement of County High being in the national finals of the Bar Mock Trial competition which will take place at The Old Bailey in London on the 21st March. A cast and crew of over 50 upper school students presented a hugely entertaining and inventive production of Roald Dahl's *Fantastic Mr Fox*, skilfully directed by Mrs Moorhouse.

Students enjoyed the competitions, music, prizes and information available over the course of the day. All funds raised have been donated to The Kite Trust; a Cambridge based charity that supports LGBTQ+ young people.



Students also had the opportunity to listen to inspirational speakers, Rabbi Irit Shillor (Stonewall inspirational speaker)



and ex-student and SWCHS Allies founder, Molly Govus. Irit and Molly spoke about various topics but underpinning their message was how we can celebrate diversity and nurture the ability to work with difference.

A spokesperson for the Allies said, "It was a wonderful day where the whole school community came together to create a friendly and supportive atmosphere in which our students can thrive and truly enjoy being themselves".

Diversity Champions:

Since September, we have been working hard to raise the visual profile of our BAME students, and are pleased to have been awarded a Stonewall Silver Award. We have been working with Pastor Andrew Jackson, a regular visitor to the school, who has kindly offered a variety of focused interventions for students; have been working with Uttlesford District Council and now have 20 trained Hate Incident Ambassadors in Years 11-13 who not only offer after-care for students who have experienced hate incidents but also run restorative justice sessions. SWCHS now has a group of Allies whose first main task has been to create a new page for the student planner as well as providing input in the new PSHE programme and preparing a celebrative assembly for Ramadan. An ex-SWCHS student came in to run a very successful academic enrichment lecture for Sixth Form on the use of racist language and banter and our Allies were so inspired by a private meet and greet with Benjamin Zephaniah earlier in the academic year they are now working on an exciting multi-cultural Arts project with Saffron Hall.

foot and Metro to take in the sights, including a visit to the Louvre museum, the palace of Versailles, and the artist quarter of Montmartre. They also benefited from a visit to the Museum of Liberation, with the opportunity to see artefacts from when Paris was occupied in the Second World War, linking closely to the A Level French curriculum.
