These payments are on top of the usual student loan / maintenance loans given by Student Finance.

1. Low Income Grants / Scholarships

- * A low-income scholarship is **paid in instalments**, while a bursary or grant will be a **one-off payment** near the start of your course.
- * You may receive funding for your first year only, or for each year of your course.

- * This money can go towards your general living or study costs, and you can decide how you spend this.
- * Some forms of low-income support may reduce your annual tuition fees, or come with additional benefits, like discounted accommodation, or career-building opportunities.

Low-income bursaries can be awarded as part of the Student Finance process...

Applying for a low income scholarship, bursary, or grant is relatively simple – it can happen as part of your Student Finance application.

Your university will access your household income from your student finance body, to make their decision. They will contact you if you're eligible for any low-income support.

You must make sure that – household income is submitted as part of the Student Finance application. (Make sure to apply every year)

2. Other Financial Support / Scholarships / Bursaries

There are also other funds that students could be eligible to apply for - but the students / parent need to find them, the funds will not automatically be applied.

Many organisations offering scholarships, grants or bursaries, struggle to attract enough applicants at times.


Make this part of the application process...

Where to start looking for scholarships, bursaries and grants?

- 1. Check with the university directly look at the extra funding offered by your university choices (ask at Open Days or contact them directly)
- 2. Look at **subject choices** most are awarded for academic, sporting or musical achievements, those studying particular subjects or as part of a widening participation initiative.
- 3. Look at employers who are running scholarship schemes
- 4. Look at charities and specialist interest groups
- 5. Check the **Scholarship Hub** website...

The Scholarship Hub

- Use the filter tool to search for specific needs / courses / institutions.
- Always put in undergraduate for level of study.
