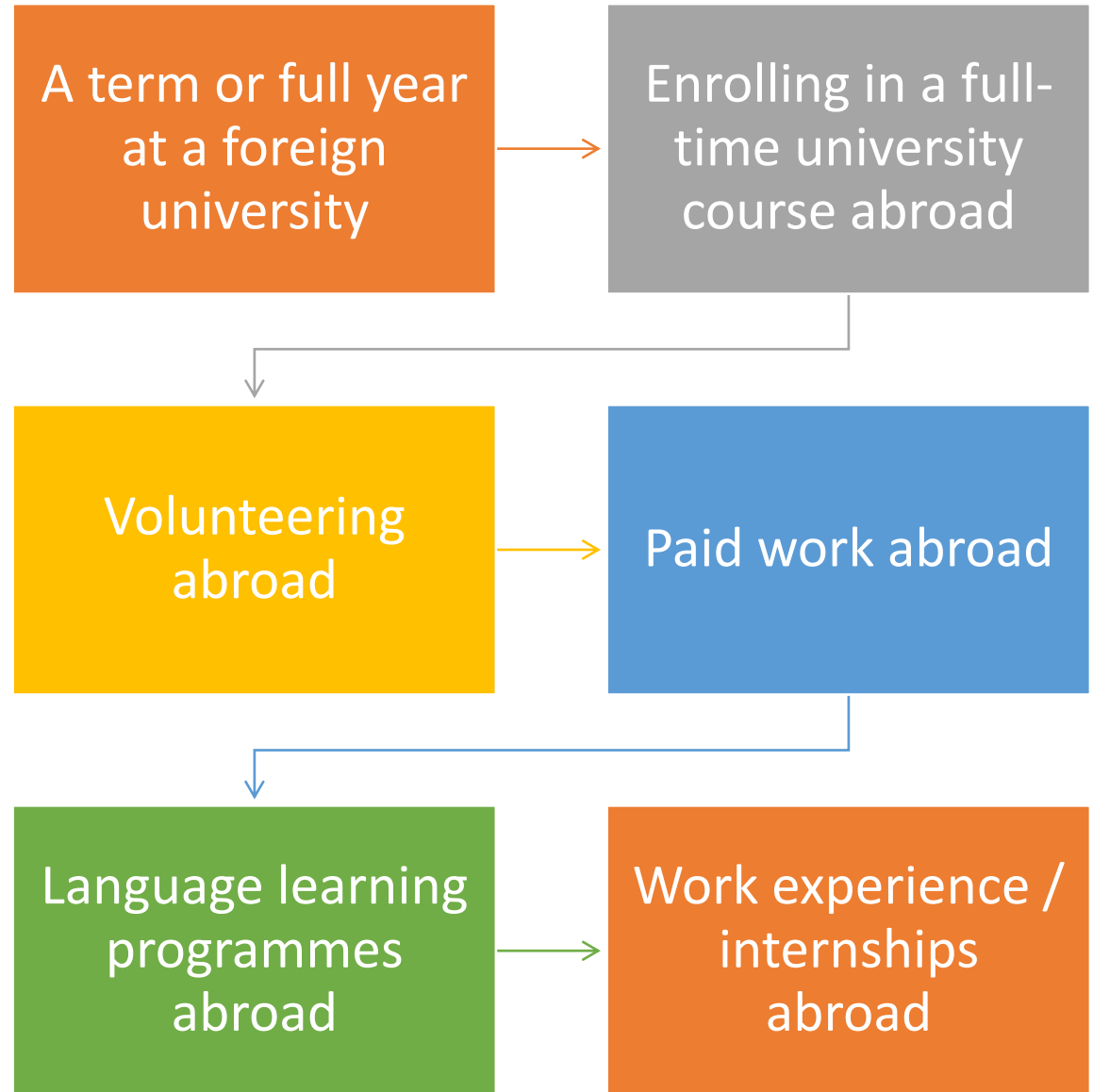

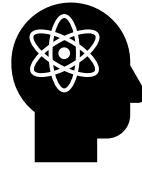

The UK's global programme for studying, working and living abroad, offering once-in-a-lifetime opportunities for personal and professional development for students.

This year (2022) the funding application submission window started on **31 March** and ended on **29 April**.

Important considerations































- Hidden costs of working/studying abroad - travel, accommodation, currency, Visas
- Many volunteer programmes incur costs
- International courses and scholarships are very competitive
- Visa restrictions may prevent part-time work whilst studying
- Foreign university courses may seem cheaper but are not covered by UK Student Loans
- If considering a 'gap year' before university study, we **strongly** recommend making a UCAS application in Year 13 and then ask to defer a place
- Many **UK** university courses (not only Modern Languages) offer a 'Year Abroad' in the 2nd/3rd year - Business, Law, Engineering, English, Politics, Economics, Drama...
- Many university courses in non-English speaking countries may require a Language qualification (e.g. B2/C1 European Framework)

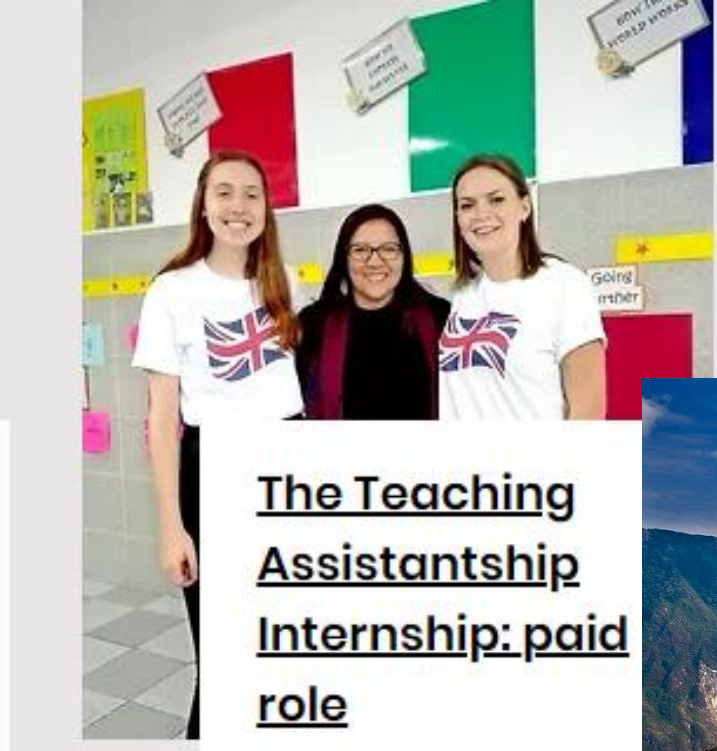

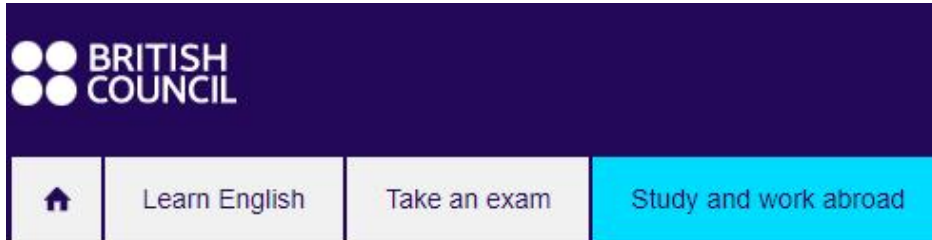

Teach abroad as an English Language Assistant

Teach English in one of 14 destinations. Applications for 2022-23 are now closed.

This year the application submission deadline to work as an English Language Assistant was **1st February 2022.**
