Students learned about George Downham, Andy Porter and Charles Pearson, residents of Saffron Walden who served and died in the First World War. Students were invited to tie ribbons on the Sixth Form balcony area as an act of remembrance.

Year 12 has been introduced to Unifrog, a platform we use to help students start shaping their futures. They have also received talks on how to create a compelling CV and should now be finalising these, in preparation for the Rotary Interviews next term.

Life Lectures

As part of the Life Lecture programme, Year 12 received an excellent talk by Mr Cox about the impact of drugs on his family. He explained some consequences of drugs that aren't always considered or talked about. This month, students also had the benefit of listening to guest speaker Emma Cole, HIV ambassador. Emma shared anecdotes from her experience, describing what it's like to live with HIV.

In life lessons this month, alongside exploring Unifrog and CV writing, Year 12 revisited the topic of contraception. These lessons considered the risks and reliability of each type of contraception, as well as treatments for STI's.



Early Applications

We are proud of students who are starting to receive invitations to interviews for Oxford and Cambridge. A fantastic achievement! All students have received a mock interview to help them prepare, and SWCHS is happy to host any online interviews if required.

Support has already begun for **Year 12** students intending to make competitive university applications for medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or Oxbridge. If you have not yet signed up, but intend to apply in one of these areas, please contact Dr E Wood as soon as possible.

University Applications

As part of the Life Lecture curriculum, we welcomed Exeter University to SWCHS, to provide additional support for students writing personal statements. They provided guidance on choosing the right degree and making a competitive application, including personal statement tips, information on contextual

offers and university bursary support. Please encourage your son/daughter to speak to their tutor if they have extenuating circumstances that should be shared during their UCAS application.

Anglia Ruskin University have also supported our students by offering 1 to 1 personal statement sessions. This is in addition to our own tutorials and UCAS clinic on Wednesday afternoons.

Over 70 applications have now been sent to UCAS, with many more in progress. Offers are starting to flood in! Six students have already received all their offers, and a further 56 students have received at least one offer.
