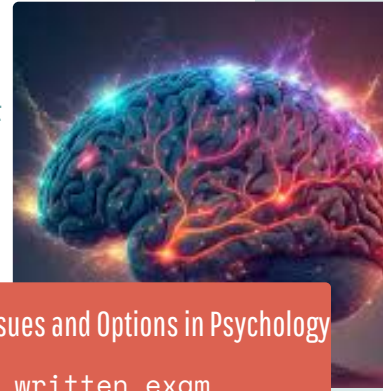




A-LEVEL PSYCHOLOGY

WHAT IS THE COURSE ABOUT?

Psychology is the scientific study of the human mind and behaviour. Studying psychology at A-Level involves learning about different theories, evaluating these using research evidence, and understanding how psychologists study different phenomena through the use of different methodologies.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW BEFORE TAKING THE COURSE?

Psychology uses a variety of skills from English, Maths and Science, therefore it is essential you have good grades in these at GCSE. You do not need to have studied Psychology at GCSE, although if you have, you can use the knowledge you have gained as a foundation to the A-Level material. Psychology is all about research, therefore it is important to be interested in how research is conducted and be critical in making informed analytical judgements. In the exam, you will be asked to carry mathematical and statistical calculations. **You need a 5 in GCSE Maths, English and Science (Biology/Combined Science) to study Psychology.**
