## The School will (in line with DfE guidance):

- Make adjustments to the school day to support the maintenance of 'year bubbles'.
- Discourage parents from gathering at the school gates and ensure no cars can come on site until 3.30pm at the end of the day.
- Establish year group 'zones' on the field to ensure that pupils remain within their 'year bubble'
- Set out directional markers on the corridors in order to establish a one-way system of moving around the school safely.
- Set clear expectations for children about sneezing, coughing, tissues and disposal and avoiding touching of the mouth, nose and eyes with hands.
- Make soap and water / hand sanitiser available to children and staff.
- Ensure everyone is handwashing or using hand sanitiser at the start of each session
- Reduce the number of assemblies conducted 'in-person' and replace them with virtual assemblies shown in tutor groups.
- Cancel overnight trips in the Autumn Term until further guidance is released.
- Ensure any extracurricular activity is fully risk assessed and that this is usually delivered in year group bubbles or with additional social distancing.
- Stagger lunchtimes to reduce the contact children have with each other.
- Keep windows open and prop doors open wherever possible to increase airflow.
- Maintain increased cleaning routines.
- Inform parents if there has been a confirmed case of COVID-19 in school.
- Provide work to do at home should your child have to isolate due to COVID-19.

# **The Family will:**

- Share and explain expectations and rules set by the school with our child/children.
- Support the school in its efforts to follow DfE guidelines in order to maintain a safe environment for all.
- Ensure my child has their own equipment including:
  - o Pen, pencil and ruler
  - Calculator
  - Glue stick
  - Scissors
  - o Colouring pencils
  - o A water bottle
  - o Alcohol gel/hand sanitiser
- Explain to our child/children that they need to stay away from students in different year groups.
- Explain to our child/children the need to work hard on all tasks and follow all instructions and all school rules.
- Instruct our children to regularly wash their hands/use hand sanitiser and follow the school's instructions on hygiene as set out in this agreement.
- Keep phones switched on and be available to collect my child/children if requested by the school.
- If our child shows symptoms, inform the school and seek a COVID-19 test and tell the school the result.
- Keep our child/children at home if a member of the household shows symptoms of Coronavirus and book a COVID-19 test.
- Not visit the school unless you have an appointment, stay as short a time as possible on the school premises, and socially distance from other visitors, staff and students.

### The Student will:

- Follow the instructions of members of staff to maintain a safe environment.
- Observe all directional makers and follow the one-way system.
- Only socialise with members of my own year group.
- Stay in my seat when in the classroom, unless directed otherwise
- Have my own equipment in class and not share it with others.
- Frequently wash my hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser as I enter each classroom, before I eat, or if I sneeze or cough.
- Follow expectations about sneezing, coughing, tissues, and disposal ('catch it, bin it, kill it') and avoiding touching of my mouth, nose and eyes with hands.
- Tell an adult if I am experiencing symptoms of coronavirus.
- Behave well in school in line with behaviour policy and Community Code.
- Work hard in lessons to ensure I, and others, can make excellent progress
- Not use my mobile phone in school; mobile phones that are seen or heard by a member of staff will be confiscated
- Maintain social distancing from friends in other year groups on the way to and from school (following government guidelines).
- Avoid touching other students, even in my own year group
- Maintain a 2m distance from adults, as far as possible
- Not use chewing gum in school.
