The best way to prepare for A level Drama is to watch as much live theatre as possible.

Below is a list of different ways that you are able to do this.

- Digital Theatre Plus This is an online theatre subscription service, with lots of incredible productions and interviews with actors, directors and designers. Some schools have a subscription to this, so speak to your current Drama department to see if they have login details you can use.
- Globe Player films—Shakespearian productions, available to rent or download.
- Keep an eye out for recordings of productions online or on TV.
- Go to the theatre! You don't have to go to the West End, regional theatres or your local amateur dramatic group will do great stuff too.

Reading a variety of plays is also extremely useful to develop your understanding of genres and performance devices. Anything will be useful! Your local library would be a great place to start looking.
