Task

You need to build up a case study of Uganda. We have chosen this country as a major case study in your first unit of Population and the Environment. What to research and include

4. Research the country today. What are the issues? Look at agriculture and health in particular.
5. How do outside agencies help Uganda?
6. What problems are facing the country? What are the solutions?
7. What is tourism like in Uganda? Could this industry help the country.
8. How will a youthful population affect Uganda?
